

The National Gem Collection

The *Hope Diamond* was cut from the famous *French Blue*, which was brought to France from India in 1668 to become part of the crown jewels. The *French Blue* was stolen in 1792 and never recovered, but in 1812 an extraordinary 45.52-carat deep blue diamond came on the market in London. Later, it was purchased by Henry Philip Hope for whom it was named. In 1949 the gem was acquired from the estate of Mrs. Evelyn Walsh McLean by Harry Winston, and in 1958 he presented it to the Smithsonian Institution. It is shown here in a diamond and platinum necklace designed by Pierre Cartier for Mrs. McLean in 1910.
